

The FSA (Farm Service Agency) NAIP Team recently provided revised information regarding the 2011 NAIP data collection. The purchase cost of the color-infrared (CIR) buy-up is now estimated to be \$150,006. Additionally, FSA has provided an opportunity to purchase a buy-up for ½ meter resolution for an additional \$750,030.

Recently the local USGS office extended an offer to share the deliverables they receive as a Federal partner to 2011 NAIP free of charge to interested parties. USGS anticipates receipt of true color QQ geotiffs (statewide coverage) in early March (no interim CCMs). If the ½ meter pilot project is awarded to Idaho and fully funded, USGS will receive and share the ½ meter data.

The process to move forward with a statewide partnership effort takes significant internal resources from the Idaho Geospatial Office for “behind the scene” efforts as well as many personnel hours on behalf of those who organize and attend Imagery Technical Working Group (TWG) meetings. Due to budget constraints in a slow economy, the offer from USGS to share their data (true color QQs -- no CIR – slight possibility of ½ meter data) is hard to resist. The Imagery TWG would like to get a sense of your commitment to partner with FSA on the 2011 NAIP project in light of USGS’ offer to share their data.
