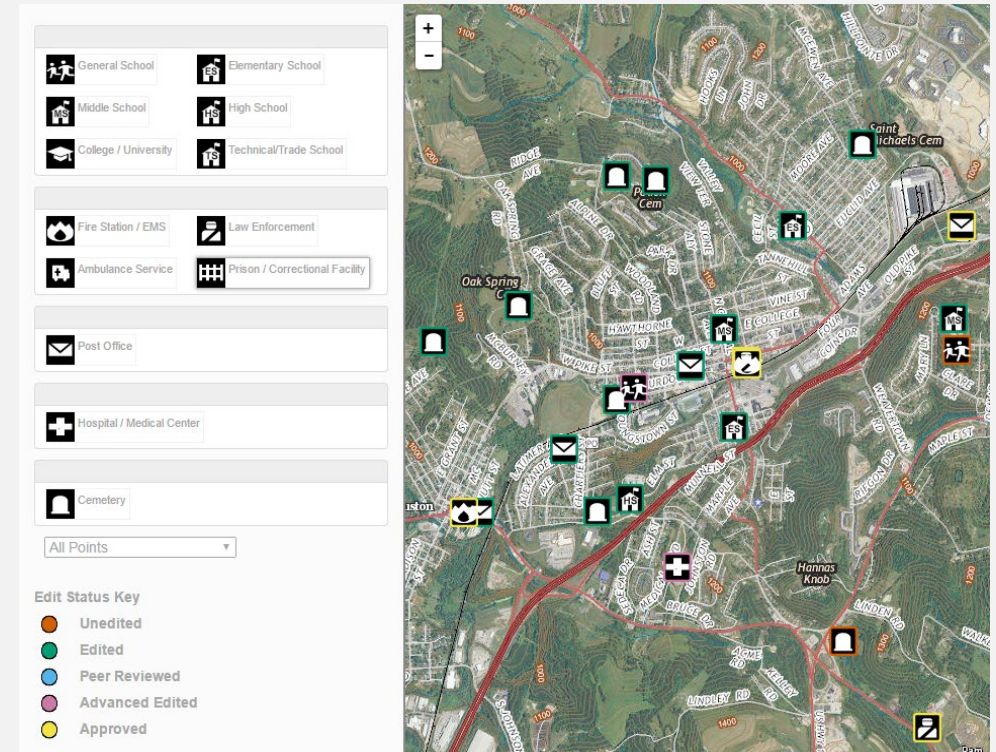

# THE MAPLAND ACT

Directs DOI, USFS, USACE to  
Jointly develop and adopt interagency standards to  
Ensure compatibility and interoperability among  
federal databases  
Collect and disseminate outdoor recreation “GIS”  
data related to federal lands





Site Type	Description
Trailhead	A designated area predominantly developed to provide transition from vehicle to pedestrian, horse, or ATV travel. “Designated” means the responsible federal agency has marked the trailhead with ground signage, or it appears on a current and official visitor map or is included in a GIS dataset provided by the responsible agency.
Visitor Center	A building or building cluster associated with (and usually, but not always, geographically inside) a federal land unit such as a National Park or National Forest. The primary purpose of a visitor center is to serve the general public through direct contact with staff and dissemination of information about the land unit. Visitor centers commonly have educational exhibits, artifact displays, and public restroom facilities. Generally, excludes primary and independent administrative office buildings open to the public and open-air structures such as amphitheaters, observation towers, or outdoor interpretive exhibits.
Campground	A designated area on which primitive structure(s) may be erected for temporary shelter and/or where recreational vehicles are temporarily parked. “Designated” means the responsible federal agency has marked the area with ground signage, or the campground appears on a current and official visitor map or is included in a GIS dataset provided by the responsible agency.
Ranger Station	A ranger station is a small building or a portion of a larger building typically where law enforcement or emergency services are available to visitors, such as where a ranger is based. For some agencies, visitor centers may be a more appropriate representation and this data should not be duplicated in both.
Cabin	A small house, cottage, or hut, usually of primitive design and often situated in a remote area. Cabins may be identified as historic facilities or buildings available for lodging.
Picnic Area	An established area for picnics which may include picnic tables and possibly other items, such as built-in grills, water faucets, garbage containers, and restrooms.
Headquarters	Administrative office which is often a center of operations for the area.
Shelter	A roofed structure that may provide cover from weather. Shelters may have other amenities such as cooking appliances or picnic tables. Where a shelter covers a picnic area, the point should not be duplicated.
Boat Ramp	A ramp into the water used to launch and land boats. Excludes docks, wharves, quays, piers, commercial industrial ramps.
Boating Site	Site (dock, wharves', quay, or pier) managed primarily to facilitate access to water for boating activities. Excludes marinas, harbors, port facilities, ferry terminals. Fed agencies have few ramps. (USFS collecting).
Water Access Point	A point along a river or lake where an individual can access the water.
